Trustee Koroll thanked Administration staff for the time and effort put into the draft of the calendar.


The Board approved the <u>2015-2016 School Year Calendar</u> which is posted to the BGRS website.

# BEAUMONT SCHOOLS CONFIGURATION REVIEW

Superintendent Yanitski reported on the Beaumont Schools Configuration Review. After the Board's request for Administration to review the configuration in Beaumont, the Committee has met with School Council Chairs and Principals. Division Principal Norm Dargis provided an update and presented a package that included a letter that was sent out to parents.

Black Gold Regional Schools' Administration is reviewing the configuration plan to find a solution to the overcrowding at École Dansereau Meadows School and seeking to limit the amount of changes to the original configuration plan. Black Gold Regional Division (BGRD) will engage affected parents by presenting the proposed amendments through two school presentations and an on-line survey. Configuration plans for students at École Beau Meadow School, École

Bellevue School and École J.E. Lapointe School will remain unchanged.

# SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS


Trustees requested a letter be written to the RCMP indicating Black Gold Regional Division's support of the School Resource Officer (SRO) Program. Superinten-

### JOHN BOLE ATHLETIC PARK UPGRADE

Associate Superintendent Andres reported that the City of Leduc will be hosting the 2016 Alberta Summer Games. As part of the project, the City of Leduc has committed to upgrading the John Bole Athletic Park which includes upgrading the track, throw area and jump areas to meet provincial standards. The Facilities Department has been contacted and there will be no additional costs to BGRS. This will be a world class facility for our students. The Board approved the upgrades at John Bole Athletic Park.
