## CELEBRATING SUCCESS



### Alberta Francophone Games

### Black Gold Student Leadership Symposium

Black Gold Regional Division No. 18 (BGRD) continues to engage youth through various Division wide opportunities. On April 22nd, a total of 270 students, teachers and parents attended a BGRD Student Leadership Symposium at Leduc Composite High School. This is the fourth BGRD initiated student leadership event to occur within the last four years. The purpose of this symposium was to expand student awareness and understanding of how they can make a positive personal impact within their school and community. At the conference, presentations focused on the key areas of comprehensive school health: the physical, mental and social well-being of peers as well as sessions regarding technology leadership.

Students had the opportunity to listen to keynote speakers:

Grade 7-12, Ryan Porter, focused on helping young people find their path to a successful future;  
and Grade 4-6, Tracy Lookwood, focused on PLAY education.

Students also attended age appropriate breakout sessions on a variety of topics related to this year's theme and discussed with their school peers, strategies on how they can expand leadership within their school environments.

Leduc Composite High School was well represented with four teams participating at the St. John Ambulance Provincial First Aid Competition April 30<sup>th</sup>. LCHS club members competed against sixteen other teams from Alberta industries and other youth teams from Edson and Red Deer. The accident scenes were staged in West Edmonton Mall with high school actors from Tofield and St. Albert.

For Emergency First Aid, LCHS team "Code Blue" placed second. First place winners were from team "Trauma Trinity". The Team Leader individual award was won by Team Captain Carolyn Geiger.

## VIMY RIDGE CONSULTATIONS

The safety of BGRD students and staff is the first priority for the Board of Education. In light of recent world events, the Board directed Administration to engage students, parents and chaperones to gather their feedback regarding the future of the Vimy Ridge Canadian Heritage Tour 2017. The Board always reserves the right to cancel/modify trips in the interest of student and staff safety. Upon receiving the important feedback, the results were presented to the Board.

Consultation meetings were set up in the various communities with opportunity to ask questions, and the options of cancelling or continuing the trip was explained. Trustees discussed the consultation meetings and final results. Trustees mentioned that the final decision lies with the parents, and if someone wants to withdraw from the trip, they are able to do so. Trustees also recognized the detailed work of staff who planned the trip. Trustees have expressed appreciation in all of the consultation meetings and hard work in preparing the results.



Motion defeated: that the Board cancel the Vimy Ridge Canadian Heritage Tour 2017 Trip.

Superintendent Yanitski stated that any fundraising for the Vimy Trip would follow students in a parallel trip, which is in the spirit for which the money was originally raised.

Motion carried: that the Board supports a parallel field trip in the spirit of the Vimy Ridge field trip to destinations in Canada, during Spring Break of 2017.

Trustee Koroll stated that this motion opens up the trip to other students as well. Trustees directed Administration to inform students, parents and staff of the options for the trips. Trustee Kobeluck thanked Trustees and Administration for the discussions and concerns for the trip. Associate Superintendent Romanchuk thanked the Board for the direction on the trip, and requested financial help for sub time to allow a staff member to work on an alternate trip.

## 2016-17 BUDGET

The Board approved the Budget Report to be submitted to Alberta Education for the year ending August 31, 2017 with the budget projecting \$124,057,778 in revenue, and \$125,551,273 in expenses for the 2016-2017 school year for a projected deficit of \$1,493,495 for Black Gold Regional Division No. 18. The budget highlights, plans and assumptions were presented along with significant business and financial risks. The Projected Schedule of Changes in Accumulated Operating Surplus (summary) was also presented.

Trustee Koroll commented that as the Division is opening new schools, the government does not provide full funding for new buildings, staffing and extra added costs. The Board should have discussions with the government to request extra funding for opening new schools.

Trustees thanked Associate Superintendent Andres, Finance Department, Administration and the Resource Allocation Committee (RAC) for the information brought forward. Superintendent Yanitski also expressed thanks and congratulated the Division staff as the budget will serve the students well in the next school year.



## INSPIRING SUCCESS AWARD OF DISTINCTION



Superintendent Yanitski announced that the BGRD Board of Education believes in recognizing contributions of individuals or groups within Black Gold Regional Schools that "Inspire Success" of students and staff. The criteria and guidelines for the award are on the website. The deadline is June 13, 2016.

## DIVISION FEES



Associate Superintendent Andres presented the proposed Instructional Resource Fees and Transportation Fees for 2016-2017 with no increase. Trustee Martinson stated that due to economic times, it is important to not increase the fees. The Board approved the 2016-2017 Division Instructional Resource Fees and Transportation Fees as proposed with no increase.
