ALBERTA SCHOOL COUNCILS' ASSOCIATION CONFERENCE

The Board approved the financial support for the Alberta School Councils' Association (ASCA) Conference (April 28 - 30, 2017) as follows:

- ◆ 100% of ASCA Conference Registration for up to FOUR (4) School Council members, and;
- ♦ 100% of ASCA Conference Registration for ONE (1) School Council member in the first year of School Council formation.

OUT-OF-SCHOOL CARE PROGRAM WILLOW PARK

Superintendent Yanitski announced that due to increased school enrolment and resource constraints, the Out-of-School Care Program at Willow Park School will not be able to continue. Trustee Nosyk



stated that the Program started when there was more space at the school, but due to increased growth in enrolment, the Program cannot continue and parents need to be informed as soon as possible.

The Board will serve notice that the Out-of-School Care Program at Willow Park School be dissolved for the 2017-2018 school year.

SCHOOL VISITS

Trustees and Administration attended school visits on February 2nd to Leduc Estates, Black Gold Outreach-Leduc, Covenant Christian and École Corinthia Park.

Trustee Martinson commented that there are exceptional staff doing awesome work with students.

MODULAR LINK FOR ROBINA BAKER & BEAU MEADOW



Associate Superintendent Andres advised the Board that BGRD has been approved for 13 new modulars within our Division. Administration is recommending that BGRD construct a link from the new modular to the core school at Robina Baker Elementary School and École Beau Meadow School The recommendation for the connecting link is based on student safety, as well as ease of servicing the modular. The cost of building the links is not supported by the Government of Alberta and must be funded by BGRD. The projected cost is \$75,000 per connecting link.

The Board gave approval to build a connecting link at Robina Baker Elementary School and École Beau Meadow School with an estimated cost of \$75,000 each.

The Board will write a letter to the Government of Alberta requesting funding for the connecting links.

The Board requested Administration to form a committee to look at the Devon grade configuration and future growth plan.

WARDS & ELECTORAL SUBDIVISION BOUNDARIES



Superintendent Yanitski stated the Black Gold Regional Division No. 18 Bylaw No. I-95 regarding electoral wards and subdivisions was reviewed to determine if it needs to be updated prior to the 2017 general election. After receiving legal advice, it was determined that the current bylaw clearly shows where people should vote and no revisions are required at this time.
