BGRD School Bus Driver Training

The Government of Alberta is changing the licensing and training requirement for bus drivers. Effective July 31, 2019, new school bus drivers must take the Mandatory Entry Level Training (MELT) Program.

Black Gold Regional Division is very fortunate that we now have two professional licensed driver trainers for school bus drivers. Lorraine Spurrell of Graylo Transportation and Transportation Manager Sue Timmermans are fully certified licenced driver trainers for Class 2 drivers. The process to obtain this status is quite lengthy and both Lorraine and Sue successfully completed three knowledge tests and in-yard and on-road testing over the course of the last two months. UDENT **EXCURSION REQUESTS**

The Board gave final approval to the student excursion request from École Secondaire Beaumont Composite High School. The field trip is to Italy and Greece from July 2 to 11, 2019 for 33 Grades 10 to 12 students with five supervisors.

> The Board gave approval in principle to the student excursion request from Thorsby Junior-Senior High School and Warburg School. The trip is to France and Italy from March 25 to April 5, 2021 for approximately 30 Grades 10 to 12 students with approximately 5 supervisors.

The Board gave final approval to the student excursion request from École J.E. Lapointe School. The field trip is to Quebec City and Ottawa from June 21 to 27, 2019 for 29 Grade 7 French Immersion students with six supervisors.

> The Board gave final approval to the student excursion request from École Bellevue School. The trip is to Quebec and Ottawa from June 20 to 26, 2019 for 14 Grade 6 French Immersion students with one teacher supervisor and 13 parent volunteers.

> The Board gave final approval to the student excursion request from École Champs Vallée School. The trip is to Quebec, Montreal and Ottawa from June 20 to 26, 2019 for 23 Grades 6

and 7 French Immersion students with two teacher supervisors and 14 parent volunteers.

ECIAL BOARD MEETING - APRIL 24, 2019 EMORANDUM OF AGREEMEN CUPE 3484 SCHOOL SUPPORT STAFF

The Board ratified the Memorandum of Agreement for CUPE #3484 School Support Staff effective September 1, 2019. The agreement includes:

- Improvement for vacation accrual changing from 10 years to 8 years, retroactive to September 1, 2018.
- 45 cent/hour increase for school secretaries at Step 6 for all three levels, retroactive to September 1, 2018.
- 0% increase for 2018/19
- 0.5% increase for 2019/20
- 1% increase for 2020/21
- One additional personal day changing from one (1) day to two (2) days per school year effective September 1, 2019.
- An employee shall be granted one (1) working day with pay per school year to attend the funeral of a person other than those referred to in previous agreement. The Employer may grant additional days with or without pay, and without loss of seniority.
- Health Spending Account The unused balance will be carried forward to the extent permitted by the CRA (Canada) Revenue Agency).
