The Board gave final approval to the student excursion request from New Sarepta Community High School. The trip is to Berlin, Prague, Krakow and Budapest from March 27 to April 5, 2020 for 14 Grades 10-12 students with two teacher supervisors and one parent volunteer.





MEETING WITH MINISTER OF EDUCATION



On January 23, 2020 our School Board engaged with Education Minister Adriana LaGrange in a short meeting at the Leduc Recreation Centre.

The purpose was to introduce the Minister to the school division, it's demographics, the quality educational programming offered and Division dynamics. Trustees shared the core values that guide us, and the Division's core purpose "To Inspire Success"!

Trustees shared with the Minister, the Division's high academic standards, it's ability to offer inclusive education and choices in programming for all students. They also expressed their gratitude for Provincial Government assistance in meeting the Division's needs as it continues to experience rapid growth.

Minister LaGrange also heard firsthand about the financial hardships Black Gold is facing. She heard very clearly that the Division is in an unsustainable and tenuous position as a result of the most recent Government budget. Despite the dire consequences the Division faced with the release of the budget in October, Black Gold committed to keeping staff in the schools to mitigate the negative impact on our students, teachers and communities by reducing funding to other departments and areas.

In conclusion, Minister LaGrange appreciated the comments, accepted suggestions/solutions as information but reiterated that there is no way out of Alberta's current staggering deficit except through austerity budgets and reducing services. She urged the Division to continue searching for efficiencies and to not expect changes in the direction provincial fiscal decision making is going. She also assured Trustees that the budget would come out in the spring, and will support small schools.

ECOLE J.E. LAPOINTE SCHOOL GRAND RE-OPENING



Superintendent Romanchuk announced that the Grand Re-opening of École J.E. Lapointe School will be Thursday, March 26, 2020.

The substantial completion on the school was achieved on December 20th, and all the spaces are now occupied. There was a lot of extra time spent on moving students to different spaces, and staff and students dealt with all the interruptions. At the end of the day, the school is a beautiful space.

There will be an article in the February issue of an architectural magazine, *Award*, that features École J.E. Lapointe School. The Communications Department will share the article with Trustees once a copy is received.
