Funding for Students

- The current funding formula does not fund student enrolment growth. The Weighted Moving Average (WMA) funding allocations are based on enrolment from previous years. We are always lagging behind when trying to meet the needs of current students
- Allow school boards the autonomy to accumulate and maintain reasonable operating reserves to mitigate potential emergencies and deal with student growth, and the power to address these concerns.

ASK YOUR CANDIDATE: Should your party form government, how will you ensure that annual funding meets the needs of a growing school community and the School Division's ability to address unforeseen events.

Spaces for Students

- Many schools in Beaumont, including the current high school, are at or exceeding capacity. While the City of Beaumont has provided a letter of commitment to provide serviced land for a new school, the Province must announce a new school for Beaumont.
- Several of our modular classrooms are at their end-of-life. We need to replace these classrooms to ensure students have clean and safe areas to learn.
- Operations and Maintenance funding must be adequate to ensure that the physical and mechanical structures in existing schools remain safe for student learning.
