THREATENING BEHAVIOUR

Background

Employees, students, parents, volunteers and other visitors will conduct themselves in a manner which promotes a learning and working environment that is free from threatening behaviour.

Definition

A <u>threat</u> is a declaration of intention to punish or hurt. It indicates a menace of physical or psychological harm or injury to reputation or property. The threat may be delivered in person or by phone call, letter or electronically.

Procedures

- 1. Threatening behaviours that could escalate into physical danger, are to be reported to the appropriate authorities.
- 2. Although there may be no threat of physical danger, threats of a psychological nature or those suggesting injury to reputation are to be reported to the appropriate authorities.
- 3. Threats of immediate physical danger are to be reported directly to the RCMP and as soon as possible thereafter to the Associate Superintendent, Human Resources and Administration.
