



The students really enjoyed making glitter jars!













École J.E. Lapointe School is proud to share a Black History Periodic Table one of their teachers created and posted in the hallway outside her classroom.

Each square has letters that represent the first and last name of a Black person, their name, a description of who this person is/was, and each colour of the squares indicates a particular area of contribution (e.g. authors, entrepreneurs, scientists, famous firsts, government, etc).

While the names are mostly American, she did add a couple Canadians, and plans to add more over time.


The students each focused on a different Black Canadian and summarized their important role in Canadian history. The students also created a class "quilt" to share with others in their school.






École Dansereau Meadows School Principal Susanne Stroud read stories to students in honour of Black History Month.
