Welcome Back! Opening the doors this September had a different feel to it than most years, with many new protocols in place.

While we are not working under ideal circumstances, the feedback we are hearing is that students and staff are happy to be back, and that things are going smoothly. In addition to our physical schools, our new Distance Learning School is up and running with 13 per cent of students from across the district accessing their education this way.

Thank-you for your patience, feedback, and encouragement as we develop this school in the midst of full operations. Your comments have been very supportive and helpful.

After six weeks back at school, there have been three reported cases of COVID-19 associated with Black Gold Schools. We can't express enough the pride we have for all BGSD staff in the resilience and tenacity they have shown to prepare for and operationalize school re-opening.

We are grateful for the huge role that our parents and guardians have played in supporting all our students with back to school. Now more than ever, we need our whole Black Gold family working together to keep our community transmission rates low and our grace and support for one another high. Thank you for your continued understanding and support.

Welcome back students and staff! With the addition of our distance education program on top of the regular staff shuffle, most schools will have some new staff faces this year. We hope by now you’re feeling at home in your new schools. A big welcome to those new to BGSD!

Around town, we are pleased to announce that the large construction project at Caledonia Park School is wrapping up and that the school now has access to considerably more much-needed space! Thank-you to all the teams involved in completing this project on schedule. In addition, the site preparation has begun on the plot of land allocated to the future new high school in the City of Leduc. The school will take approximately three years to build once the prep is completed.

Finally, in anticipation of the new BGSD ward structure that will come into effect in October 2021, the Board voted to update Policy 7 to assign wards with multiple trustees as primary contacts for the schools. This will ensure the equitable division of resources, and will help to facilitate stronger relationships within the community.

The policy update will affect County East/ Beaumont and Leduc after the election in 2021, as these communities

will have multiple trustees serving the areas. In preparation for this, the trustees in Leduc will adapt to this change for the 2020/21 school year.

Govt. of Canada Safe Return to Class Fund

Black Gold School Division is most appreciative of the Alberta Government's decision to allow school boards much-needed flexibility in allocating the recently announced federal funding to support COVID-19 related costs.

In total, the Province is distributing around \$282 million in two payments to local school authorities as a per-student grant. The first payment was made in September, and the second will be made later in the school year. Black Gold School Division's portion of the funding is approximately \$4.5 million.

In accordance with the federal government's funding guidelines, Black Gold School Division will allocate funds to address pandemic-related costs such as additional personal protective equipment and cleaning/disinfection supplies, anticipated costs for substitute teachers, and staffing and supports for the division's distance education program.

"We are facing significant costs related to the ongoing public health crisis, and this funding announcement, along with the afforded flexibility in spending, allows us to ensure the safety and well-being of staff and students, and provide a brand new level of service in distance learning," said Board Chair Devonna Klaassen. "We thank both orders of government for this much-needed funding, for without it we would have to draw on our already limited reserves."

School Councils

While the way you meet and contribute to your school may be different this year - thank you to everyone participating in your school councils, and congratulations to those taking on leadership roles. We value your support and engagement, and look forward to meeting with all of you throughout this school year.

A reminder that the Alberta School Councils' Association (ASCA) is a body that represents parents on school council to engage with the Ministry of Education. The ASCA Regular General Meeting was held virtually on October 17, 2020, from 10 a.m.-3p.m. Each ASCA member council was allowed one vote. BGSD purchases memberships for all our school councils. Program Unit Funding Advocacy

As we work our way through this first year under the new education funding framework, we are finding both strengths and challenges.

While we are appreciative of the Province's decision to provide school authorities with the flexibility to direct funding to support the specialized learning needs of students, we recognize that the revised Program Unit Funding (PUF) model is in its first year of implementation, and is in need of fine-tuning as it moves forward.

The Board of Trustees and Administration are advocating to Alberta Education, Alberta Health, and Alberta Children's Services regarding what we see as much-needed changes to the PUF model to mitigate serious unintended consequences that are causing the program to fail the vulnerable children it is designed to support.

While BGSD continues to meet the needs of children requiring supports, there have been considerable changes to our programming. We will continue to make this programming a priority; we know that early intervention works, as is evidenced by our ongoing success in this area.

Audit Committee

The Board of Trustees is pleased to announce the appointment of three public members to our Audit Committee. The purpose of this committee is to assist the Board and Superintendent in fulfilling their oversight responsibilities for the financial reporting process, the system of internal control over financial reporting, the audit process, and monitoring the Division's compliance with laws and regulations pertaining to financial operations.

This year marks the first year in which public members are a part of the audit process for BGSD, and is in accordance with the *Education Act* update. The appointments for two-year terms with a minimum of two meetings per year.

2020 Celebration of the Arts

This event has been postponed due to the ongoing public health crisis; however, but there may be an opportunity for students to participate on a smaller scale at a 25th Anniversary celebration of Black Gold Schools. Details to follow.






