









The Grade 6's from Mrs. Cable's Math class at Willow Park School practiced drawing different types of triangles and measuring their angles by coding Probots.

these beautiful creations! AWESOME ART FROM 2A



Robina Baker Elementary School had a few school wide dress up days, and there was great participation in all classes. Here are two collages from St. Patrick's Day!






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École Leduc Estates School is hosting a Lucky Ducks campaign for school staff! Each day, a number will be called on the announcements and the lucky staff member with that number will


