

Students at Willow Park School are enjoying the newly painted games out on the school tarmac.









With the approach of warmer weather, students and staff at École Coloniale Estates School had fun participating in their Friday Run Club.










Mrs. Baptiste's Grade 1 class at École Champs Vallée School had fun making shape monsters in their online Math class.








Mrs. Lloyd's Grade 1 class at École Champs Vallée School played the Floor is Lava online. What fun!

École Corinthia Park School staff and students had a fabulous afternoon participating in their Jump Rope For Heart challenge.









École Coloniale Estates School students celebrated June is Pride Month. Mme Desmarais' 5F-1 class created a display in recognition of June being Pride month.










