


SCHOOL NEWS FEBRUARY 2022

Cupid visited Willow Park School on Valentine's Day, delivering hearts and goldfish to all the students.





École Beau Meadow School was a sea of red and white to show their Canadian pride for the start of the Winter Olympics!













The Grade 4s at École Corinthia Park School have been learning about the history of Head Smashed in Buffalo Jump, and how the First Nations use each part of the bison to survive.

February 18th was 90's Day at Covenant Christian School. Suffice to say, it was like, totally radical, dudes!


















Grade 3-2 students at École Coloniale Estates School had to build a bridge for Science spanning 30cm that could withstand the external force of the mighty Dogman!
