LEDUC RECONFIGURATION UPDATE

Associate Superintendent Dargis presented an update on the Leduc Reconfiguration. The public Advisory Committee met to provide feedback on April 4.

The next meeting is scheduled for May 9. The online engagement opportunity was open Apr 5-19. 356 responses were submitted.

APPROVAL OF FEES

Division Tuition and Technology Fees are to remain the same for 2023-2024 as they were for 2022-2023. The Division Transportation Fees will also remain the same, with the addition of a Supplemental Bus Fee for students accessing an additional bus to or from an alternate address.

The Division has started working with outside agencies to bring international students from Colombia and Japan to Black Gold schools during the 2023-2024 school year. Administration created a fee schedule for these students, which will cover all expenses related to the International Student Program.

CALMAR SECONDARY SCHOOL EXCURSION TO THE SKILLS CANADA NATIONAL COMPETITION

DUAL CREDIT

Terri Reid, Curriculum Manager, and Danielle Manchak, Dual Credit and E-Learning Lead Teacher presented information about BGSD's Dual Credit program and Collegiate School. Dual Credit is a partnership where students can earn both post-secondary and high school credits in partnership with post secondary institutions.

The Collegiate School will assist with the Dual Credit experience. It will help with a focus on experiential learning. Our Collegiate School will focus on the trades and business programs. Students can complete a first year apprenticeship and graduation requirements.
